Snap-Fact News



- 1. MALWARE MAYHEM Over 6,000 new computer viruses are created and released worldwide every month by hackers whose efforts are now enhanced by automated software that writes its own viruses (via AI). There are currently more than 1 billion malware programs floating around. It's estimated the cost of cybercrime in 2023 was around \$8 trillion worldwide. Still, a virus cannot install itself or corrupt a PC/device on its own, since it must be downloaded and then clicked on in order to install and activate. [source: cybersecurityventures.com]
- 2. BIGGER ISN'T BETTER 73% of U.S. adults are considered Overweight or Obese. 31% are considered Overweight (BMI of 25.0 - 29.9) and another 42% are Obese (BMI of 30.0 or greater). Of the 42% Obese, 3% are considered Severely Obese (BMI of 40.0+). The U.S. has the 12th highest obesity rate among 191 ranked countries. Worldwide, 13% of adults (663 million), are considered obese. - 3. PHARMA PHENOM Introduced in 2017 as a diabetes treatment, but now widely used as a weight-loss drug, semaglutide (generic name for Ozempic, Rybelsus and Wegovy) has quickly become one of the most popular drugs in the U.S. with 8.2 million prescriptions written last year – four times the amount written in 2021. Novo Nordisk, the maker of Ozempic, Rybelsus and Wegovy, had combined sales of \$21.1 billion in 2023, an 89% increase over 2022, which now represents 65% of its total revenue. U.S. sales last year were responsible for 71% of all semaglutide revenue. Mounjaro, a similar drug by Eli Lilly that was launched in 2022, had sales of \$5.2 billion in 2023, its first full year on the market. [source: pewresearch.com]
- 4. OUCH THAT HERTZ Hertz recently fired its CEO after a failed bet that EVs would be the future of car rental demand and ordered 100k Teslas, 175k GM EVs, and 65k Polestar EVs, as its plan to move forward coming out of bankruptcy. Subsequently, when Tesla cut prices on its new cars, resale values dropped significantly, destroying Hertz's EV lifecycle profitability assumptions. Hertz quickly sold off 20,000 of its EVs, citing poor rental demand, unacceptable depreciations, and the high cost of repairs and maintenance. As a result, the company wrote off \$245 million of its EV investment, and reported its biggest quarterly loss since the pandemic. In 2014, a previous Hertz CEO made a big bet on passenger sedans, just when consumer tastes and rental demand shifted to SUVs. [source: fortune.com]
- 5. EXORBITANT ENDEAVORS The most expensive single thing ever made is the International Space Station, costing \$100 billion, followed closely by the most expensive building ever built, which was the Great Mosque of Mecca (Masjid al-Haram) in Saudi Arabia, completed in 2020 and costing almost \$100 billion. The F-35 military fighter jet is the most expensive weapons program ever undertaken, with a total cost to develop and acquire the jet squadrons estimated to be \$412 billion. The F-35 pilot's helmet is so sophisticated that it alone costs \$400,000. The James Web Space Telescope cost \$10 billion, and CERN's Large Hadron Collider in Switzerland, one of the most complex scientific instruments ever built, cost \$4.75 billion. [source: various]
- steamfitters by 2027, which is expected to drive up installation and repair costs, and slow down construction and infrastructure projects. The main reason is that many plumbers are now retiring, and employers are struggling to recruit a new generation of trained professionals, given the well-paid but not-so-glamorous vocation's reputation for involving dirty and physically strenuous work. - of-sale purchase to the nearest dollar and donating the difference to charity (a.k.a. "keep the change" programs) raised a whopping \$749 million in the U.S. in 2022, a 24% increase from 2020. Taco Bell alone collected \$42 million via roundups, averaging \$0.44 per donation. Uber, Lyft, McDonalds, **7-Eleven**, and just about every **grocery store** and **fast-food chain** now employ these programs. Their success has led to more scrutiny on how the money is being spent.
- 8. CLIMATE COCKTAIL The U.S. is the only country in the world having a portion of its landmass in all five climate zones: temperate, tropical, dry, continental, and polar. [source: noaa.gov]
